OCULAR MANIFESTATIONS OF CROUZON SYNDROME: A RARE CASE

Mr. Priobroto Pramanik Mohadeb, a 9-years old-child came to our hospital from Sirajganj district with a gradual loss of vision in both eyes. He had VA – FF in both eyes, we found that he had MGD with Dry Eye Syndrome and bilateral developmental cataract in a child with Crouzon syndrome.

Crouzon syndrome disease:

Crouzon syndrome is a genetic disorder characterized by the premature fusion of certain skull bones (craniosynostosis). Craniosynostosis is the most common inborn skull

abnormality, resulting from untimely fusion of sutures of the cranium. The incidence of this disease is 1.6 per 100,000 population, constituting 4.5% of all craniosynostosis patients. Many features of Crouzon syndrome result from the premature fusion of the skull bones. Abnormal growth of these bones leads to wide-set, bulging eyes and vision problems caused by shallow eye sockets; eyes that do not point in the same direction (strabismus); a beaked nose; and an underdeveloped upper jaw. The severity of these signs and symptoms varies among affected people. Individuals with Crouzon syndrome usually have normal intelligence. Early and correct diagnosis of Crouzon syndrome is critical for treatment planning and timing of every procedure. The prognosis depends on the severity of Crouzon syndrome.

Management of Crouzon syndrome Medical care

Almost half of the cases had potentially correctable causes, including amblyopia and ametropia. Early detection of eye problems to reduce amblyopia by correction of refractory errors and timely treatment of strabismus and patching are indicated; optic atrophy remains an important cause of visual impairment before cranial decompression. To relieve airway obstruction, a nasal continuous positive airway pressure device may be needed. Close otologic and audiologic follow-up is indicated to detect sensorineural hearing loss. Management of speech may be necessary by speech therapists.

Surgical care

Surgical treatments are:

- a. Fronto-orbital advancement with cranial decompression.
- b. Correction of midfacial hypoplasia With procedures such as Le Fort III osteotomy or its segmental variants, monobloc fronto-facial advancement, and bipartition osteotomy.
- c. Craniofacial disjunction procedure, followed by gradual bone distraction (Ilizarov procedure) - Reported to produce complete correction of exophthalmos and improvement in the functional and aesthetic aspects of the middle third of the face without the need for bone graft, in patients aged 6-11 years.
- d. Adult Crouzon syndrome, often presenting with marked midface hypoplasia and exorbitism, can be corrected by orbital decompression and zygomaticomaxillary advancement.

Alport Syndrome: A Rare Case Report

Alport Syndrome:

Alport Syndrome is a genetic disorder affecting around 1 in 5,000-10,000 children. It is caused by an inherited defect in type IV collagen which is an important structural component of basement membranes in the kidney, inner ear, and eye. Eighty percent of the patients have sensorineural deafness and 40% of the patients have lenticonus and retinal flecks in the eye.

Diagnosis & Treatment:

A 20-year-old male patient attended our department with complaints of gradual deterioration of vision in the left eye for 7-8 months. The patient had a history of cataract surgery in the right eye, 2 years ago. On examination, the right eye vision was 6/12 and the left eye vision was FC3m, which was not improved with glasses or pinhole. Anterior lenticonus was seen in the left eye and the lens was clear. In the left eye, direct ophthalmoscopy showed an oil droplet sign in the lens. A routine examination of the urine of the patient reveals the presence of RBC. We suspected the case was Alport Syndrome from the above findings. We referred the patient to the ENT specialist and examination showed moderate to severe sensorineural hearing loss in both ears. After phacoemulsification with foldable posterior chamber intraocular lens implantation in the left eye patient vision improved to 6/9.

Early diagnosis is critical not only for the management of systemic features but also for visual rehabilitation in collaboration with the nephrologist, the ENT specialist, and the ophthalmologist. Clear lens extraction with posterior chamber intraocular lens implantation should be carried out for better visual prognosis.






Figure: Anterior Lenticonus





Figure: CFP-R/E -Normal






Figure: CFP L/E mild haze
