They were always around and addressed any questions and clarifications from trainees. Their utmost priority was patient safety first and I learned a lot from them. I also got tips to improve my SICS. They offered not only mentorship in academics but in other aspects of patient care such as reminding me of my purpose as a doctor and as a human being. Special thanks to them. The entire OT staff was a nice set of people. They were always smiling, helping to address all concerns like patient selection and timing of surgery. I observed a system of good collaboration and a high level of communication and responsibility. The staff are dedicated to their work, emphasizing maintaining asepsis, showing compassion to patients, managing time appropriately, and accurately keeping records. Another exciting part of OT sessions was having the opportunity to watch other trainees doing surgery.

The training also involved access to other aspects of patient care such as pre-and post-operative assessments, biometry sessions, and a library with assorted books and journals. There is also an avenue for continuous interaction with the trainers even after returning to my country such as WhatsApp groups for trainees and provision of contact information by some trainers.

Fellow post-operative follow-up Treatment of a one-eyed patient epithelial defect with S/P Vitreo retina surgery: A case report

Patient Md. Mojibur Rahman, 53 years old was diagnosed with Right eye- blindness and Left eye- Persistent epithelial defect with S/P Vitreo retina surgery. Visual acuity in the left eye was 3/60. The patient had PPV+ EL+silicon oil due to RD 6 months back. Silicon oil was removed 3 months before. At the cornea clinic, we did left-removal of loose epithelium+AMG with fibrin glue+BCL+ temporary central tarsorrhaphy a month back. On the 7th POD tarsorrhaphy was removed. The epithelium was found to be healing. BCL was kept in situ and after 1 month epithelium healed very well.

A 70-year-old lady came to our hospital with a complaint of increasing pain decreased visual acuity and heaviness in the left eye for 5 days. She had a history of cataract surgery in the left eye 7 days back. On examination visual acuity was light perception and intraocular pressure by Goldman applanation tonometer was 55mm of Hg in her LE. Slit lamp biomicroscopy revealed severe conjunctival injection, intense corneal oedema absent central and peripheral anterior chamber, iridocorneal touch centrally, and posterior chamber pseudophakia. An ultrasound B-scan ruled out posterior segment pathology, which showed no vitreous or choroidal abnormalities. with no other ocular history. Based on history and clinical examination we diagnosed the patient as malignant glaucoma.

In the RE, the visual acuity was 6/6 with correction and spectacle, Intraocular pressure was 17mm of Hg by Goldman applanation tonometer and slit lamp biomicroscopy revealed no abnormality in the posterior chamber and fundus. Immediately patient was admitted to the hospital and treated with oral acetazolamide 3x500mg, topical timolol and brimonidine combination 2x1 and topical brinzolamide 3x1 along with topical cycloplegic atropine 1% 3x1, iv mannitol 20% 2x500 ml. ND YAG laser peripheral iridotomy was performed. After 12 hours intraocular pressure (IOP) was 47 mm of Hg despite a patent iridotomy in the left eye, absent AC with severe corneal edema. The diagnosis of pseudophakic malignant glaucoma was confirmed as no resolution of symptoms and signs. ND YAG laser capsulotomy was done.

Despite maximal systemic and topical therapy, the desired result was not achieved. Finally, after 24 hours we decided to perform 23G pars plana anterior vitrectomy and anterior hyaloidotomy. Anterior hyaloid face and anterior vitreous were removed in order to eliminate the blockage and aqueous misdirection completely. That was confirmed by the deepening of the anterior chamber pre-operative.

First day postoperative, the AC depth increased and the IOP became decreased to 28mm of Hg. The patient was discharged with visual acuity hand movement in her LE, reduced corneal edema, and normal AC depth. After a month, the corneal edema resolved, the visual acuity was 1/60 and the IOP was 20 mm of Hg. The fundus showed peripapillary atrophy, with cup disc ratio of 0.6. After 3 months of postoperative follow-up, the visual acuity improved in the LE to 3/ 60, IOP 17 mm of Hg, and normal AC depth. The patient continues with topical brimonidine and timolol combination, with no relapse of signs and symptoms in a 6-month follow-up.

The need for pre-training in experimental eye surgery has paramount importance. It is an essential way to assess trainees of ophthalmology based on their instrument, tissue handling, and skills. Traditional surgical training, as a sole method, is considered to be of increased risk for the patient. Thus, the need for training in experimental surgeries is considered a prerequisite. IIEI&H Cataract training programs permit a trainee to acquire and maintain a high skill level through regular wet-lab discussion sessions. The overall aim of IIEI&H wet lab discussions is to help our local and international trainees achieve surgical proficiency. Wet lab discussion also allows for practicing novel surgical techniques and preserving, updating, and acquiring new skills from our experienced trainers. Usually, wet-lab discussions focus on each procedure from tissue preparation to post-operative care, demonstrate graft insertion and positioning techniques, potential surgical challenges and complications, and how to manage them well.
